Dedicated Service Award

The ASME Dedicated Service Award is awarded only once in a lifetime to an ASME member, through ASME Honors & Awards, and honors unusual dedicated voluntary service. A member must have been active for 10 years in the area(s) of service for which the Award is granted.

The Award requires three Sponsor members who are knowledgeable of the service of the nominee, to nominate a member. In addition, two other members who can attest to the nominee's qualifications and requirements, are Endorsers of the Award.

Finally, the overall nomination of a Dedicated Service Award, must be nominated by a member of the ASME Board of Governance, like a Governor, Officer, or one of the Vice Presidents. Clint's Nominator is Keith Thayer, Past President of ASME, as well as Past Chairman of South Texas and the Petroleum Division, just to mention three.

Clint Britt's Leadership in South Texas: a brief summary

An energetic and innovative leader, Clint is a constant advocate for quality educational opportunities for ASME members and student members.

Clint rejuvenated the Plant Engineering and Maintenance Technical Chapter in 1995, which has become one of STS's most successful Groups, on which he currently serves as Treasurer. In 2001, he co-founded the Plant Engineering Trade Show which is the largest source of funds for the South Texas Scholarship Endowment Fund, which issues scholarships annually to five area colleges. He serves as their Treasurer. Clint founded the Endowment Fund to ensure scholarships for future years, and serves as its Chairman.

Clint founded the Seminars Program in the mid-1970's which continues currently, with well over 10,000 members in the Past Region X area benefiting from educational enrichment. He is a Past Chairman of South Texas, having filled all the Officer positions. He has received numerous South Texas Meritorious Service Awards during his close to 40 years of service. He was awarded the Alan J. Chapman Award for years of service in many capacities, and has received the Dean W.R. Woolrich Engineer of the Year twice from South Texas, which honors technical achievement as well as service, as he has had several careers as a mechanical engineer. Clint is an ASME Fellow.
